Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the total cost per person and what does it include?

Total cost is \$270/ person and it includes activities, room and board (4 nights lodging and 11 meals), camp materials, and camp T-Shirt.

2. When is total cost due?

The final balance is not due until *June 1, 2009* but you will need a \$50/person deposit in order to register.

3. Can I register without a deposit? And do I need names to register?

You cannot register without a deposit. You will need a \$50 deposit/person to reserve those spaces. And no, we will not need names. All we need to register is a total number. (Chaperones and campers)

4. When do I receive camp paperwork?

We send our camp packets out at the beginning of March. This allows us time to finalize our activities, workshops, and any other changes for camp.

5. What if someone backs out? Do I get their deposit back or can I transfer it to the remaining balance?

Unfortunately, no. However, you can replace that person with someone else and transfer their deposit to the other person. And if you let us know before the *June 1 deadline*, you will not be charged the remaining balance for that person.

6. Will I be able to add to my group total?

As long as there is space available. If there isn't space left, we can always put them down on a waiting list.

7. What is the age limit for camp?

Campers need to have just completed sixth grade up to graduating seniors. College students are welcome to attend as chaperones.

8. Can I come to camp as an individual or with a small group that is not a church?

As long as you have a chaperone, we will welcome any group regardless of size. Unfortunately, we cannot have any teenagers unchaperoned. This is a change from years past in which we allowed individuals to come without chaperones.

9. What about Day Campers?

Unfortunately, we cannot take day campers. Any person desiring to come to camp must have a chaperone and must stay on campus the entire week.

10. What are the accommodations like?

You will be staying in college dormitories. Each room is double occupancy and has two beds (twin size), two desks, two chairs, and two dressers. *(There are a few one and three person rooms on campus that we use.)* Bathrooms vary based on each dorm. *(Some rooms have private baths, some share with the room next to it, and some have hallway baths shared by all.)* You will need to bring your own linens.

11. What if someone in my group has special needs?

If you will let us know in advance, we will try to meet those needs. Gardner-Webb is a Handicap Accessible University, including dorm rooms.

12. How many chaperones do I need to bring and what are their responsibilities?

You will need to bring 1 chaperone for every **8-10** teenagers. This needs to be separate for both males and females. Their responsibilities are to make sure that all of your teenagers are getting to where they need to be throughout the day. They are also there to help advise and counsel your teenagers with their daily walks with Christ. Throughout the day, chaperones will participate in all activities as if they were a camper themselves (with the exception of tournaments). ***You must have at least one male and one female chaperone if your group contains both genders.***

13. What if one of my chaperones has children they need to bring with them?

Camp life, especially dorm life, is not really conducive for children. Although our preference is that children do not come to camp, they are allowed under the following guidelines:

- 1) If they are over the age of 4, they will need to share a room with a parent of the same gender and they will also be charged at a discounted rate of \$120 for the week.
- 2) Newborns through 3 year olds can stay with either parent and there is no charge.
- 3) Gardner-Webb does have apartments that are separate from the dorms and can be used by families. However, it will be additional \$25/person for the week and these chaperones cannot be included in the 1:8 ratio that we ask for chaperones.

14. What does the basic schedule look like?

15. What do the morning and evening worship services look like?

The morning celebration time is more casual and contains the Crossroads Morning Show. It is a fun and casual way to begin the day.

The evening service is much more structured and involves Praise/Worship as well as sermons from Clayton King and Matt Orth.

16. What are the morning workshops?

Morning Workshops are a time where your teenagers will have the opportunity to attend 3 interactive seminars that deal with issues that teenagers face today. ***Workshops will be separated based on age.*** Although this year's topics have yet to be decided, the following is a list of past workshop topics:

Purity, popularity, basics of our faith, creation/evolution, service, where we fit in to our church, how the Bible was put together, etc.

17. What are the afternoon activities?

During the afternoon, you and your group will have the opportunity to participate in a variety of activities which includes, but is not limited to:

Sports (Tournaments), Football, Soccer, Basketball, Ultimate Frisbee, Frisbee Golf, Volleyball, Arts/Crafts, Board Games, Musical Lounge/Jam Session, Art Studio, Team Challenge Course, Dodgeball, Sports Tournaments, Video Scavenger Hunt, Relay Races, Missions Project, Outdoor Adventure Games, Climbing Tower, Day at the River and more...

They can choose whichever activity/(ies) they wish from 12:30-4:30pm. Some of these activities are open to anyone anytime. Other activities require sign-up and they will have the opportunity to do so when you arrive and throughout camp.

None of these activities are mandatory, but we strongly encourage you and your chaperones to make them mandatory among your group. In other words, you have the option of requiring your students to participate in some type of activity for the duration of these 4 hours. Your students will only have free time if you allow them to.

Each of these activities are well supervised by our trained staff.

18. What is church group devotion time?

Church group devotion time is a time in which your particular group will be able to get together by yourselves. We provide no structure to this time in an effort to allow you to do as you see fit. Some groups talk about the day and what they are learning, some groups come prepared with four devotions for the week, etc. This is your time with your group.

○ **IMPORTANT FINANCIAL INFORMATION ***

- A registration deposit of \$50 per person is required for all CRWW camps and is due by the assigned date. The deposit is non-refundable. If a camper cancels, their deposit cannot be applied to a group balance, but can be transferred to another person as their deposit.
- Once registered, you can add campers to your total as long as space permits. Please call our office to verify space availability when adding campers to the first deposit.
- Final balances must be sent in by June 1, 2009. **There will be a \$5 per person per day late fee added to any balances not paid by June 1, 2009.** Please call our offices if you will not be able to meet the deadline.
- Note: Balance payments are refundable if cancelled **in writing before the balance due date.** After the due date **no refunds** will be issued.
- *****After the balance due date - you are responsible for payment of the number registered at that date.**
- If you have cancellations, please call **before** the due date to avoid paying the balance for spaces you will not be using. You will still be financially responsible for any cancellations after the balance due date.
- Fees must be paid with a church check, personal check, money order or credit card. \$25 will be charged for a returned check. If you have any
